Answer This can be established by checking with the Higher Education Institution (training provider) who are providing the apprenticeship training as the training can be delivered differently by each provider.	
HEE Funding Application Process 21/22 22.30 minutes	https://youtu.be/1gB3uLgdnGI	Question I have an apprentice who started this month and we missed out on HEE funding for 20/21 due to appointing into the position after the last deadline. Are we able to still apply for 21/22 funding for the Sept cohort for this person, who started her apprenticeship in Jan 2021? Answer Yes, you can apply for funding for this person and we will treat them in exactly the same way as all the other expressions of interest in funding received. However, HEE's provision of salary support for study will not be retrospectively paid from January 2021 it will be paid from September 2021 which is the first cohort in 21/22 academic year.	A word version of HEE's funding application form to be distributed, so that employers know what info is needed before starting to complete the form





		Question Does HEE's Advancing Practice funding support a Primary Care Network (PCN) Additional Roles Reimbursement Scheme (ARRS) employee? Answer Yes, they can be employed in PCN's. We have previously supported applications for funding from local care organisations. Also, the funding can be applied for if the person is in an ARRS role because they are different funding streams. Question If a GP Federation is employing the Advanced Practitioner on behalf of a PCN can they submit the Expression of Interest (EOI) funding form? Answer Yes, that is fine.	
Breakout Session Greater Manchester	https://youtu.be/X_5dFmPY8sE	Question When a student is working supernumary (supernumerary meaning that students cannot be counted as part of the workforce when they are learning in a clinical setting) how can we quantify they are supernumary but also ensure we give them the level of mentorship and ensure safe practice? Answer There is no requirement for the student to have supernumary status for the Advancing Practice apprenticeship at Manchester Metropolitan University. The only requirements is for the employee to work a minimum of 30 hours a week and meet the	





		20% off the job training requirement. It is up to each individual HEI and employer to determine whether the employee needs supernumary status for the learning they are undertaking. Regarding the 20% off the job training, it is recommended the employers consider the learning needs across the whole week and not just the University learning days the trainee AP undertakes.	
		Question Bolton University now say you don't need to have a DMP as a direct supervisor for NMP. Is that happening in other HEI's? (A Designated Medical Practitioner is the medical practitioner who directs and supervises a non-medical prescriber's period of learning in practice which forms part of non-medical prescribing qualification requirements)	
		Answer This won't be the same for every HEI but most Universities should be on board with the new standards for NMP qualifications by next September. There are still a few Universities that have not gone through that process because it was pushed back with the NMC due to Covid-19. Recommend to check with local HEI.

		Answer If the employee is employed in an ARRS role they will need to complete the PCPEP training first before undertaking the Advancing Practice programme. (The Centre for Pharmacy Postgraudate Education (CPPE) is commissioned by HEE to deliver training to pharmacy professionals working in primary care as part of the primary care Network Contract Directed Enhanced Service (DES). We have developed the Primary Care Pharmacy Education Pathway (PCPEP) to align the education requirements of the pharmacists and pharmacy technicians.) Question Now we have the First Contact Practitioner Pathway, is that essential to undertake first before going on the Advancing Practice programme at University? Answer No, it is not necessary to have completed the modules on the First Contact Physio Practitioner Pathway as a pre-requisite to undertaking the Advanced Practice programme at University.
