Skills for health conversation- Masterclass day

This course uses motivational interviewing techniques to explore ways patients can best respond to health change conversations. This two-day course comprises a Masterclass day and a simulation day. - Understand key principles of motivational interviewing
- Develop and practice basic skills seen in motivational interviewing
- Practice ways of asking questions and speaking with clients to bring about behavioural change
- Recognise where a person is in the circle of change

- Practice the skills with simulated patients covering topics such as:
- Managing diabetes/medication compliance, Cardiovascular Disease/weight management, Sexual Health, Smoking cessation conversation and Identifying clients that aren't ready to make changes but deliver effective alternative interventions.

Eating disorders for children and young people simulation

This one-day interactive simulation training course is designed for professionals who are working with children and young people (CYP) with eating disorders (ED).

Learning objectives

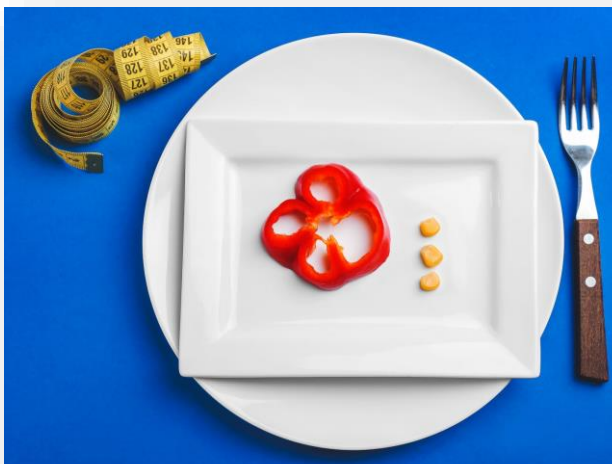
- To enhance knowledge, confidence, and skills to work with children and young people with eating disorders.
- To feel confident in taking a history focusing on the eating disorder symptoms as well as physical symptoms and sequelae secondary to a significant restriction of food intake.
- To learn strategies used to help YP & their families understand the impact of eating disorder.
- To recognise the presence of comorbidities & how they can potentially contribute to increased risk

Medical doctors, psychiatrists, RMNs, physical health nurses, dieticians, GPs, and family therapists, support workers, care coordinators who are working with children and adolescents with eating disorders in any setting.

Learning objectives

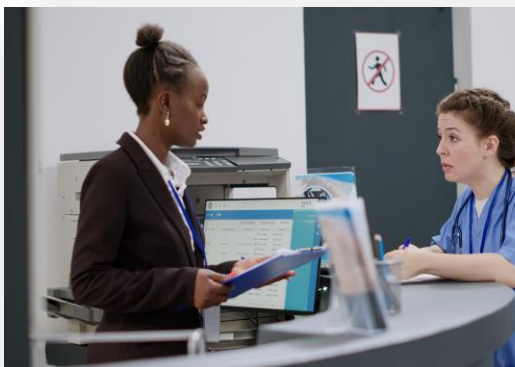
- Develop Knowledge of mental illness and treatments

Learning objectives

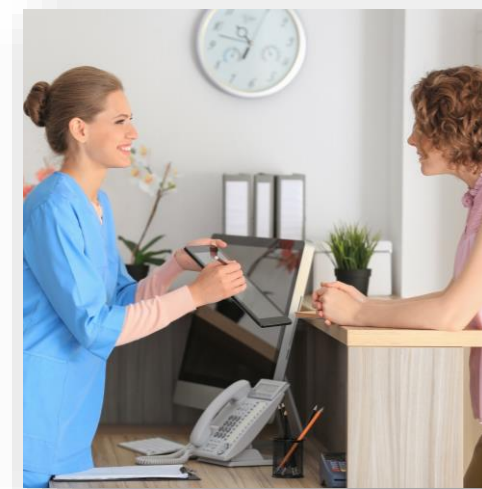
- Embedding the learning by using the skills developed in day one.

Managing Challenging situations for non-clinical staff in clinical settings – Simulation course

It will explore some of the skills required for communication with individuals that use our services as well as increasing confidence in managing difficult situations. The course will give participants the opportunity to be involved in a series of simulated scenarios using actors and will use an established debrief model to assist participants to learn positively and constructively from this experience.

Learning objectives

After completing this course those attending will:

- Feel more confident in managing interactions with service users and carers
- Feel more confident when communicating with confused, distressed and agitated service users
- Have an increased understanding of how to manage difficult conversations with other stakeholders.
- Be able to reflect on some of the feelings experienced by service users when in contact with our services.
- Be able to identify and reflect on individual interpersonal skills and how they can impact on service user experience.
