They contain information such as licensed indication, licensed dose, cautions, contraindications, reported adverse drug reactions, and storage requirements. They sometimes include information about whether tablets/capsules can be given in a different way i.e. whether they can be split, crushed, dissolved in water or administered via a feeding tube.
