Course Summary	T-Levels are new courses which follow on from GCSEs and are equivalent to 3 A-Levels. These 2-year courses have been developed in collaboration with employers and businesses so that the content meets the needs of industry and prepares you for work, further training or study. T-Levels offer you a mixture of classroom learning and 'on-the-job' experience during an industry placement of 750 hours over the duration of the course. T-Levels will train you with the knowledge, skills and behaviours you need to enter skilled employment in a particular occupation, or to continue to study that technical subject at a higher level. If you want to play a vital role in developing the nation's young people, then a T level course in Education and Childcare is for you. Work with, or for the benefit of children, by studying the issues affecting them, including health, play, social influences and rights. Alongside your course you will spend 20% of your course working in a , childcare setting gaining valuable experience
